## **Process and UDO Completion**

#### Expectations:

- The consultant will present and lead the code development process through adoption, and is expected to provide presentation materials, incorporate feedback, etc.
- The Unified Development Ordinance is to be presented in a format and language that is user-friendly and accessible to the general public and that has black and white code references eliminating grey interpretations. The extensive use of graphics and other devices that will enhance the readability and ease-of-use of the ordinances is required. Also required is an internet-ready version of the UDO with "clickable" links that are extremely user-friendly and creative in digital content/management. Immediately following adoption of the UDO, the Evansville-Vanderburgh County Area Plan Commission shall receive 25 hard copies, one digital copy, and an internet-ready copy of all elements of the final document, including graphics/illustrations. In addition, all sections of the ordinance, including any graphic files, are to be provided in the appropriate digital format. The City of Evansville and Vanderburgh County shall retain ownership of all data generated.

- Timeline with milestones:
  - Provide phases for the project: outline what information comes in when, what information you will need from the APC, etc.
  - Use assumed NTP of October 5, 2018
  - Assume a 3-month adoption process for the final UDO
  - The APC's targeted total project implementation date is <u>June 1, 2020</u>

#### 7) Cost Estimate:

• Final Service fees will be negotiated upon selection. However, in an effort to assure the full anticipated costs are understood by the City and County and to assure an accurate comparison between submissions, all proposing consultants must submit an estimated project cost. The total fee should be all inclusive and includes all personnel, meetings, presentations, public hearings, and public outreach. The internet-ready version of the UDO with "clickable" links shall be separated out as a separate line item within the cost estimate. All submissions shall provide a separate statement specifically summarizing the basis for any subsequent fees not estimated in the cost estimate. Please note this cost estimate can be used in the evaluation of proposals, but is mainly intended to help in budgeting for this project.

Note: Items that are shown highlighted in yellow are changes to the original Request for Proposal and shall be considered as part of the documentation requirements to be taken into consideration and submitted with the overall proposal.
