

Topic: What's new for Arc Online

We had general introductions of members attending including Jim Gowen, Bill Foucault, Joe Mayer and Robin Greenwell.

We reviewed the What's new in the September release of ArcGIS Online, including the new Apps Button available with your ArcGIS online account. The Apps button provides quick and easy access to the AppStudio, Developers Site, Marketplace, Open Data, Story Maps, and Survey123. We reviewed each application, and discovered an easy to install app in the marketplace call Admintools by GeoJobe, which allows for easier updates to layers, tags, groups, user roles for all your content and users in ArcGIS online. We also worked thru the simple process to create story maps. And viewed all the new templates for creating new hosted feature layers. We had time to review the new easier to view format for online content, with bigger text boxes with edit funtions for each section. They've added tabs to help you get to the content faster, view usage, and update settings and even edit data.

I placed a local training/resource guide on the network, this has links to our REST pages, our data locations, and links to help get you started using the ArcGIS Desktop software.
